

### O1 Introduction to the World Food Forum Youth Assembly

#### **Overview**

The World Food Forum (WFF) Youth Assembly is a youth-led platform empowering young people
to engage in policy discussions on agrifood systems challenges and opportunities. It provides a
structured space for youth to systematically contribute to agrifood systems policy and governance
processes, ensuring their voices influence local, regional and global decision-making.

Bringing together diverse stakeholders such as young farmers, young parliamentarians, civil society groups, Indigenous youth, academia, youth organizations and partners, and national youth delegations, the Youth Assembly fosters inclusive and diverse participation.

#### **Objectives**

The primary objectives of the Youth Assembly are to:

- advocate youth inclusion in the work and formation of policy products of the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) and other intergovernmental processes;
- ensure meaningful youth engagement in intergovernmental processes;
- adopt youth inputs and perspectives in policy formation; and
- translate inclusive policies into youth-led action.


#### Role of the Youth Policy Board

The Youth Assembly is guided by the WFF <u>Youth Policy Board (YPB)</u>, an annual cohort of young leaders who act as its steering body. Composed of passionate youth leaders with expertise in food, agriculture and youth empowerment, the YPB ensures that youth voices are heard in key intergovernmental processes.


The YPB sets strategic priorities, plans activities, defines discussion agendas and contributes to key outcome documents. They seek to inform policy by ensuring that youth perspectives and inputs are gathered through inclusive dialogues and then presented in intergovernmental spaces. They also seek to bridge global policies with local action, driving tangible impact through initiatives like the <u>Global Youth Action Plan 2025–2026</u>.







#### Structure of the Youth Assembly



The Youth Assembly is youth-led in practice and design. While FAO hosts the Secretariat, the platform is governed and managed by the YPB. The YPB sets priorities, leads consultations, develops the agenda and prepares key outcome documents.

FAO continues to provide strategic guidance and support to ensure youth engagement aligns with major intergovernmental processes where youth input can make a meaningful difference. It also supports the Youth Assembly through the FAO Technical Divisions, which contribute subject-matter expertise and institutional knowledge to enhance the quality of discussions.

The Youth Assembly also benefits from the contributions of the <u>WFF Young Scientists Group</u>, another youth-led board created to provide scientific evidence and technical input. Every two years, this group produces a scientific report informed by the Youth Assembly's discussions.


Additionally, the <u>Youth Assembly Partner Organizations</u> also provide technical support and help strengthen outreach and engagement.

Critically, the Youth Assembly brings together a broad and diverse community of young stakeholders to ensure inclusive representation through the <u>Youth Representatives Programme</u>. This includes young farmers, young parliamentarians, civil society youth groups, Indigenous youth, academia, WFF National Youth Chapters, youth organizations and partners, and national youth delegations.

By uniting these voices, the Assembly ensures that a wide range of perspectives contribute to shaping agrifood systems policy.







### Regional and thematic Youth Assembly sessions

The <u>Regional Youth Assembly's consultations and sessions</u> are a structured and inclusive process designed to engage youth from different geographic regions in identifying, prioritizing and addressing challenges and opportunities in agrifood systems. These consultations and sessions align with WFF's mission to empower youth as key stakeholders in agrifood systems transformation.

Regional consultations and sessions aim to:

- address regional specificities by facilitating discussions tailored to the unique challenges and opportunities within Africa, Asia and the Pacific, Europe and Central Asia, Latin America and the Caribbean, Near East and North Africa, and North America;
- amplify youth voices and ensure diverse regional youth perspectives are heard, particularly regarding sustainable development and agrifood systems transformation;
- promote inclusivity by creating platforms for youth from various backgrounds including Indigenous communities, young farmers, students and activists to engage in regional policymaking processes; and
- inform national, regional and global policies with actionable recommendations that reflect youth priorities.


The <u>thematic Youth Assembly sessions and consultations</u> are inclusive, action-oriented platforms that engage young people in key policy areas essential to transforming agrifood systems and advancing sustainable development. They aim to empower youth as changemakers and active participants in global, regional and national policy processes.

These processes aim to:

- drive youth engagement across ten priority thematic areas that are essential to sustainable agrifood systems;
- amplify youth perspectives through structured dialogues and consultations that bring together
  young people's technical expertise, perspectives collected through lived experiences, and
  innovative ideas to inform policy priorities and global agendas;
- link youth-led action to intergovernmental processes by generating evidence-based recommendations that contribute directly to international frameworks, conventions, and decisionmaking platforms on food and agriculture; and
- encourage interdisciplinary and cross-sectoral collaboration by fostering inclusive spaces where
  youth from diverse cultural, educational and professional backgrounds co-create holistic and
  impactful solutions.

#### **Ethiopia Room (in-person location)**

To get to the Ethiopia Room at the FAO headquarters in Rome, follow these steps:

- Starting from building D: Upon entering FAO Headquarters via the entrance on Viale Aventino (under the Moroccan flag), you will arrive at building D.
- Proceed towards building B: you will find signs inside the building that will guide you in the right direction.
- Once you reach building B, locate the elevators or stairs. Take them to the second floor.
- After arriving on the second floor, follow the signs to Room C-285, known as the Ethiopia Room.
   The room should be well-marked and easy to spot on this floor.
- You will also find a map of the building at the end of this document.

In response to the <u>United Nations Convention to Combat Desertification</u> (UNCCD) <u>Decision 19/COP.16</u>, FAO and UNCCD are developing guidance on avoiding, reducing and reversing the degradation of agricultural lands, which will be presented at The 17th Conference of the Parties (COP17) to the UNCCD in 2026.

The session will provide an overview of the draft guidance and create space for youth to engage directly with experts in shaping its content. By sharing perspectives on sustainable land use, food security and climate resilience, young people will help ensure that the guidance is inclusive, relevant, and impactful for addressing global land and soil degradation.





Participants will take part in an intergenerational dialogue, hear insights from Rome Water Dialogue country representatives and explore strategies for strengthening meaningful youth participation. The outcomes will contribute to the Youth Assembly 2026 Water Roadmap, helping to shape actions that connect FAO, its Member States and global youth networks working on water.



The Youth Assembly session on the 2nd UN Food Systems Summit Stocktake +4 (UNFSSS+4) provided a platform for actors across the food system to reflect on progress since the 2021 UN Food Systems Summit and look ahead with ambition.

The presentation of the UNFSS+4 Youth Declaration on Food Systems called for bold and decisive action across three pillars: advocacy, empowerment and action. This Youth Assembly session will ensure momentum is brought from UNFSS+4 to the WFF flagship event and beyond.

Participants will hear from the WFF Youth Policy Board and the UN Food Systems Coordination Hub on the consultative process that led to the Youth Declaration and engage in an interactive dialogue on how each region's identified priorities can move from policy to action.

Participants are encouraged to familiarize themselves with their region's priories <u>here</u> and join the session with ideas on how to implement, finance and scale youth-led initiatives that address today's food systems challenges.






